

State campaign account notification

Electoral Act 1985 (SA) - Part 13A, Division 3

Under Part 13A of the *Electoral Act 1985*, the agent of a candidate, group, registered political party, or third party must establish and maintain a state campaign account with an authorised deposit-taking institution (ADI) for state electoral purposes.

A third party is not required to hold a state campaign account if they do not receive any amount that must be paid into such an account.

Use this form to:

- Notify the Electoral Commission of South Australia (ECSA) of your state campaign account details.
- Update ECSA if any of those account details change.
- This is a fillable PDF. You can enter information directly into each field.

 Use the **Tab** key to move forward through fields and **Shift + Tab** to move backward.

^{*} If a candidate has not appointed an agent, and is not endorsed by a registered political party, then they are their own agent. If a group in a Legislative Council election has not appointed an agent, and is not endorsed by a political party, then the person whose name appears first in the group is the agent.
